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1. Getting started

Location

Important

Do not place your E2 in the bathroom or other humid areas.

Place your E2 base within reach of the mains power and telephone wall socket. The socket-outlet should be installed near the equipment and should be easily accessible.

Make sure that it is at least 1 metre away from other electrical appliances to avoid interference. Your E2 works by sending radio signals between the handset and base. The strength of the signal depends on where you place the base. Placing it as high as possible ensures the best signal.

Handset range

The unit has a range of up to 300 metres outdoors when there is a clear line of sight between the base and handset. Any obstruction between the base and handset will reduce the range significantly. With the base indoors and the handset either indoors or outdoors, the range will normally be up to 50 metres. Thick concrete and stone walls can severely affect the range.

Signal strength

The III icon on your handset indicates that you are within range of the base. When out of range of the base, the III icon flashes. If you are on a call, you will hear a warning beep.


The line will hang up if the handset moves out of range of the base. Move closer to the base. The handset will automatically reconnect to the base.

Setting up

Important

The base station must be plugged into the mains power at all times. Do not connect the telephone line cord into the wall socket until the handset is fully charged. Use only the power adaptor and telephone line cord supplied with the product.


Connecting the base



- Plug the telephone line cord into the socket marked on the underside of the base.
- 2. Plug the power adaptor into the socket marked 1 on the underside of the base and plug the other end into the mains power wall socket. Switch on the mains power.

Installing and charging the handset

 Remove the battery cover from the back of the handset and insert the rechargeable Ni-MH battery cells supplied. Please note the '+' and '-' markings inside the battery compartment and insert in the correct direction




- 2. Slide the battery cover back into place.
- 3. If you are charging the batteries for the first time, place the handset on the base to charge for at least 16 hours continuously.

4. When the handset is fully charged, io icon will appear steady on the display. Plug the other end of the telephone line cord (make sure that one end is already plugged into the base) into the telephone wall socket.

Connecting the handset and charger (for multi-pack only)

If you have purchased a multiple pack, you will need to carry out this process for all the handsets and chargers.



- 1. Plug the power adaptor into the socket marked on the underside of the charger and plug the other end into the mains power wall socket.
- Remove the battery cover from the back of the handset and insert the 2 x AAA Ni-MH rechargeable batteries supplied. Please note the '+' and '-' markings inside the battery compartment and insert in the correct direction.
- 3. Slide the battery cover back into place.
- 4. If you are charging the batteries for the first time, place the handset on the charger to charge for at least 16 hours continuously.
- 5. When the handset is fully charged, I icon will appear steady on the display. The display will show HANDSET and handset number (e.g. 2) to indicate that it is registered to the base.

Important

Warning! Use only the approved rechargeable Ni-MH battery cells (2 x AAA Ni-MH 300mAh rechargeable batteries) supplied with your E2.

Battery low warning

If \square icon flashes on the display and you hear a warning beep every minute during a call, you will need to recharge the handset before you can use it again.

When charging, icon will scroll on the display.

Battery performance

In ideal conditions, fully charged batteries should give up to 10 hours talk time or up to 200 hours standby time on a single charge.

Note that new batteries do not reach their full capacity until they have been put to normal use for several days.

To keep your batteries in the best condition, leave the handset off the base for a few hours at a time.

Running the batteries right down at least once a week will help them last as long as possible.

The charge capacity of rechargeable batteries will reduce with time as they wear out, giving the handset less talk / standby time. Eventually they will need to be replaced.

After charging your handset for the first time, subsequent charging time is about 6-8 hours a day. Batteries and handset may become warm during charging. This is normal.

¹All talk and standby times are approximate and depend on features selected and usage pattern.


Date and time

- 1. Press oK, scroll v to CLOCK/ALARM and press oK.
- 2. The display shows **DATE & TIME**.
- 3. Press ok to select.
- 4. Enter the date using the keypad (e.g. 12--12--2018 for 12th of December 2018) and press of to confirm.
- 5. Enter the time using the keypad (e.g. 06--30 for 6:30am) and press on to confirm.

Your E2 is now ready for use.

2. Getting to know your phone

Overview of your handset



A Earpiece

B Display

C Up

During a call, press to increase earpiece volume.

When the phone is ringing, press to increase the handset ringer volume.

Press to scroll through the menu options, redial list, calls list and phonebook entries.

D Menu / OK / Mute

Press to open the Menu.

Press to select menu options and to confirm a displayed option.

During a call, press to turn mute on / off.

E Talk / Hands-free

Press to switch hands-free on or off during a call.

Press to make and receive calls.

F * / Intercom / Pulse to Tone dialling

Dial a *

Used to make internal calls and transfer calls to other E2 handsets registered to the base.

Press to switch from pulse dialling to tone dialling.

G Recall

Use with switchboard / PABX services and some network services.

H Redial

In standby mode, press to open the redial list.

I Phonebook / Delete / Back

In standby mode, press to open the phonebook menu.

In editing mode, press to delete characters and digits. Go back to the previous menu level.

J End Call / Exit / Switch Handset on / off

Press to end a call.

When viewing the redial / calls list / phonebook or when in the menu, press to exit and return to standby.

Press and hold for 5 seconds to switch off the handset.

K Call list / Down

In standby mode, press to open the calls list.

During a call, press to decrease earpiece volume.

When the phone is ringing, press to decrease the handset ringer volume. Press to scroll through the menu options, redial list, calls list and

phonebook entries.

L Keypad lock

Press and hold to lock and unlock the keypad.

M Pause / # Press and hole

Press and hold to enter a pause (P) when pre-dialling or storing numbers. Dial a #

N Do Not Disturb

Press to automatically turn on Do Not Disturb.

Press and hold to enter the call block menu.

O Microphone



A Page

In standby mode, press to ring the handset(s).

Press and hold to enter registration mode when registering handsets.

Navigating the menus

Your E2 has an easy to use menu system.

Each menu has a list of options, which you can see on the menu map on the following page.

When the handset is switched on and in standby:

- 1. Press $\frac{MENU}{OK}$ to open the main menu.
- 2. Then use \blacktriangle or \P buttons to scroll through the available options.
- 3. Press on to select an option. To return to the previous menu level, press .

 To exit the menu and return to standby, press .

Note

If no buttons are pressed for 30 seconds, the handset returns to standby automatically.

3. Using the phone

Note

The handset will automatically time the duration of all external calls. The call timer will display after the first 10 seconds of the call. When the call ends, the total duration of the talk time stays on the display for 3 seconds.

3.1 Switch the handset on / off

Press and hold $\stackrel{\circ}{=}$ to switch the handset on or off.

3.2 Calls

3 2 1 Make a call

- 1. Press 🚮
- 2. When you hear the dial tone, dial the number.

3.2.2 Preparatory dialling

- 1. Dial the number first. If you make a mistake press (1) to delete the last digit.
- 2 Press fit to dial

3.2.3 End a call

Press $\stackrel{\circ}{=}$, or place the handset back on the base or charger.

3.2.4 Receive a call

When you receive an external call, the phone rings and $f \zeta$ icon flashes on the display.

Press to answer the call.

Note

To answer calls by simply lifting the handset from the base, switch Auto answer on.

3.3 Adjust the earpiece volume

During a call, press \blacktriangle or \P to increase or decrease the volume. There are 5 levels to choose from.

3.4 Mute

You can mute your handset so that you can talk to someone nearby without your caller hearing.

- During a call, press ox. The display shows MUTE ON and your caller cannot hear you.
- 2. Press ok again to resume your call.

3.5 Intercom

3.5.1 Make an internal call

If you have more than one handset registered to the base, you can make internal calls between two handsets.

The Cicon flashes and the handset number that is being called is displayed.

- If only 2 handsets are registered to the base, press and hold ★ and the other handset rings automatically.
- If more than 2 handsets are registered to the base press and hold (★ in and scroll of to the handset that is to be called then press (♣).

3.5.2 Receive an internal call

When you receive an internal call, the \P icon flashes and the handset number that is calling you is displayed.

1. Press 4 to answer the call.

3.5.3 Transfer a call

You can transfer an external call to another hand set registered to the base. $\label{eq:canonical}$

During an external call:

- If only 2 handsets are registered to the base, press and hold ** and the other handset rings automatically.
- 2. If more than 2 handsets are registered to the base press and hold $\frac{|\mathbf{x}_{\text{in}}|}{q}$ and scroll q to the handset that is to be called then press \mathbf{x}_{in} .
- 3. When the other handset answers, press $\stackrel{\circ}{=}$ to complete the transfer.

Note

If there is no answer from the other handset press and hold $\frac{\mathcal{H}_{ini}}{\mathcal{H}_{ini}}$ to return to the external caller. The external call resumes automatically after 60 seconds if there is no answer.

3.5.4 3-way conference call

You can hold a 3-way conference call between 2 internal callers and 1 external caller.

During a call with an external caller:

- If only 2 handsets are registered to the base, press and hold ** and the other handset rings automatically.
- If more than 2 handset are registered to the base press and hold (★_{in}) and scroll to the handset that is to join the call and press or or.
- When the other handset answers, press and hold ox to connect all three callers to begin the conference call.
- 4. Press $\stackrel{\circ}{=}$ to end the call.

3.6 Hands-free

To talk to the caller without holding the handset and for other people in the room to listen to the conversation over the loudspeaker simply use the handsfree function

3.6.1 Make a hands-free call

- Press ← twice, then dial the number. The icon is displayed and the call can be heard over the handset loudspeaker.
- 2. Press 🕻 to switch the call between the earpiece and the loudspeaker.
- Press note to end the call.

Note

During a hands-free call, press \triangle or \mathcal{C} to adjust the volume.

3.6.2 Answer a call hands-free

1. When the phone rings, press 👍 twice to answer the call.

3.6.3 Switch to hands-free during a call

- 1. During a call, press 4 to put the call on the loudspeaker.
- 2. To switch hands-free off and return the call to the earpiece, press 4 again.

3.7 Redial

The last 10 entries dialled are stored in the redial list.

3.7.1 View or dial an entry

- 1. Press to open the Redial list.
- 2. Scroll \triangle or \checkmark to the entry you want.
- Press ← to dial the displayed entry or press to return to standby.

Note

If you have Caller ID and the caller's number exactly matches an entry stored in the phonebook, the name is displayed.

3.7.2 Copy a Redial list number to the phonebook

- 1. Press 🐧 to open the Redial list.
- 2. Scroll \blacktriangle or ${\P}$ to the entry you want.
- 3. Press $\frac{\text{MENU}}{\text{OK}}$, the display shows VIEW.
- 4. Scroll ▲ or Ç to SAVE NUMBER.
- 5. Press ox. The display shows ENTER NAME.
- 6. Enter the name and press $\frac{\text{MENU}}{\text{OK}}$. The number is displayed.
- 7. Edit the number if necessary, then press ox . The number is stored.

See 'Entering names' and 'Writing tips' on page 21.

3.7.3 Delete an entry

- 1. Press to open the Redial list.
- 2. Scroll \triangle or \checkmark to the entry you want.
- 3. Press $\overset{\text{MENU}}{\text{ok}}$, the display shows VIEW.
- 4. Scroll ▲ or ♥ to DELETE.
- 5. Press oK, the display shows CONFIRM?.
- 6. Press ok to confirm or to cancel.

3.7.4 Delete the entire Redial list

- 1. Press to open the Redial list.
- 2. Press ok and scroll ♥ to DELETE ALL.
- 3. Press ox, the display shows CONFIRM?.
- 4. Press ok to confirm or to cancel.

3.8 Lock / unlock the keypad

You can lock the keypad so that it cannot be operated accidentally while carrying it around.

Note

When the keypad is locked, you can still answer incoming calls and operate the handset as normal during the call. When the call ends, the keypad lock comes on again.

- 1. Press and hold 0. KEYS LOCKED and icon is displayed.
- 2. Press and hold 0 again to unlock the keypad.

3.9 Paging / Find handset

You can alert a handset user that they are wanted or locate a missing handset.

Paging calls cannot be answered by a handset.

- 1. Press on the base. All handsets registered to the base will ring.
- 2. To stop the ringing, press) on the base again or press any button on the handset.

Phonebook 4

You can store up to 50 names and numbers in the phonebook. Names can be up to 12 characters long and numbers up to 24 digits.

41 Store a name and number

If the E2 is connected to a switchboard, you may need to enter a pause in a stored number. This gives the switchboard time to find an outside line. A pause is normally stored after the switchboard access code (e.g. 9). When storing a number, press and hold # until the display shows P. You can then continue entering the phone number.

If you have subscribed to Caller ID Service and wish to display the name of your caller instead of the number, save the full telephone number including the area code to your phonebook.

You can store multiple entries with the same name. However, to prevent unnecessary duplicated entries, you can only store the number once.

- Press oK . The display shows PHONEBOOK.
- Press ok , scroll √ to ADD NEW.
 Press ok . The display shows ENTER NAME.
- 4. Enter the name and press or . The display shows ENTER NUMBER.
- 5. Enter the number and press or to save.
- 6. The display shows ADD NEW.
- 7. Enter the next name and number entry that you wish to store in your phonebook or press a to return to standby.

Entering names

Use the keypad letters to enter name	s, e.g. to store TOM
Press 8 _{TW} once to enter T.	

Press 6 three times to enter O.

Press 6 once to enter M.

Writing tips

Press (1) to delete the last character or digit.

Press ▲ or ♥ to move between characters or digits.

Press 1_ to insert a space.

Use 1_ twice to insert a dash

4.2 View or dial an entry

- 1. Press 🗓. The 🗹 icon is displayed.
- Scroll ▲ or ♥ to the entry you want.
 OR
 Enter the first letter of the name to search alphabetically.
 The first name that starts with this letter or the nearest letter in the alphabet will be displayed. Scroll ▲ or ♥ to the entry you want.

Note

When the name is displayed, you can switch between the name and number by pressing $\frac{MEN}{N}$ and then T.

4.3 Edit a name and number

- 1. Press ok . The display shows PHONEBOOK.
- 2. Press oK . Scroll ♥ to EDIT and press oK .
- Scroll or to the entry you want to edit, or search alphabetically and press or. The existing name is displayed.
- Press to delete the name if required, then enter the new name and press
 NEWU
 or
 The existing number is displayed.
- 5. Press to delete the number if required, then enter the new number and press on the entry is saved.
- 6. Press $\stackrel{\circ}{=}$ to return to standby.

4.4 Delete an entry

- 1. Press ok . The display shows PHONEBOOK.
- 2. Press ok . Scroll ♥ to DELETE and press ok .
- Scroll ▲ or ♥ to the entry you want to delete, or search alphabetically and press ox . The display shows CONFIRM?.
- 4. Press ok to confirm or to cancel.

4.5 Delete all entries

- 1. Press ox. The display shows **PHONEBOOK**.
- 2. Press ok . Scroll \P to DELETE ALL and press ok .
- 3. The display shows CONFIRM?.
- 4. Press or to confirm or to cancel.

5. Call block

Your phone can block calls by call type or by number. Up to 10 numbers can be blocked. For this feature to work, you must subscribe to Caller ID Service from your network operator. A subscription fee may be payable. You can access the call block menu by pressing and holding in standby or through the handset menu.

5.1 Block by call type

Your phone can block calls by 4 different call types, international, withheld, unavailable or payphone calls.

5.1.1 Block all international calls

- 1. Press ok, scroll ♥ to CALL BLOCK and press ok.
- 2. The display shows BY CALLTYPE and press $\frac{\text{MENU}}{\text{OK}}$.
- 3. The display shows INTERN'L, press ox.
- 4. Press \blacktriangle or \checkmark to select **ON** or **OFF**.
- 5. Press or to confirm or to return to the previous menu.

5.1.2 Block all withheld calls

- Press MENU oK , scroll to CALL BLOCK and press MENU oK .
- 2. The display shows ${\bf BY}$ ${\bf CALLTYPE}$ and press ${\bf \overset{MENU}{oK}}$.
- 3. Scroll ♥ to WITHHELD, press ok.
- Press ▲ or ♥ to select ON or OFF.
- 5. Press or to confirm or to return to the previous menu.

5.1.3 Block all unavailable calls

- 1. Press ok , scroll ♥ to CALL BLOCK and press ok .
- 2. The display shows BY CALLTYPE and press $\overset{\text{MENU}}{\text{ok}}$.
- 3. Scroll ♥ to UNAVAILABLE, press or ...
- Press ▲ or ♥ to select ON or OFF.
- 5. Press or to confirm or to return to the previous menu.

5.1.4 Block all payphone calls

- 1. Press $_{\text{OK}}^{\text{MENU}}$, scroll $_{\text{V}}^{\text{C}}$ to CALL BLOCK and press $_{\text{OK}}^{\text{MENU}}$.
- 2. The display shows **BY CALLTYPE** and press ox.
- 3. Scroll ♥ to PAYPHONE, press ok ...
- 4. Press ▲ or ♥ to select **ON** or **OFF**.
- 5. Press or to confirm or to return to the previous menu.

5.2 Block by number

Your phone can block calls by number, you can store a full phone number or an area code.

5.2.1 Turn block by number on

- 1. Press $\frac{\text{MENU}}{\text{OK}}$, scroll $\sqrt[6]{}$ to CALL BLOCK and press $\frac{\text{MENU}}{\text{OK}}$.
- Scroll to BY NUMBER and press ok .
- 3. The display shows **BLOCK MODE**, press $\frac{\text{MENU}}{\text{OK}}$.
- 4. Press ▲ or ♥ to select **ON** or **OFF**.
- 5. Press or to confirm or to return to the previous menu.

5.2.2 View a number in the call block list

- Press ok , scroll to CALL BLOCK and press ok .
- 2. Scroll ♥ to BY NUMBER and press ok .
- Scroll to VIEW, press MENU.
- Scroll ▲ or ♥ to the entry you want to view.
- 5. Press or to view or to return to the previous menu.

5.2.3 Add a number to the call block list

- 1. Press ok , scroll ♥ to CALL BLOCK and press ok .
- 2. Scroll ♥ to BY NUMBER and press ok.
- Scroll to ADD NEW, press or .
- 4. Enter the number and press or to save.
- 5. The display shows ADD NEW.
- 6. Enter the next number you wish to block or press $\stackrel{\circ}{=}$ to return to standby.

5.2.4 Edit a number in the call block list

- Press ok , scroll to CALL BLOCK and press ok.
- Scroll ♥ to BY NUMBER and press or ...
- 3. Scroll \P to **EDIT**, press $\frac{MENU}{OK}$.
- 4. Scroll \blacktriangle or \P to the entry you want to edit and press \P or \P .
- Press to delete the number if required, then enter the new number and press on, the entry is saved.

5.2.5 Delete a number from the call block list

- Press MENU oK , scroll to CALL BLOCK and press MENU oK .
- Scroll to BY NUMBER and press MENU or .
- Scroll to DELETE, press ok .
- Scroll ▲ or ♥ to the entry you want to delete and press MENU. The display shows CONFIRM?.
- 5. Press ok to confirm or to cancel.

5.2.6 Delete the call block list

- 1. Press or , scroll \P to CALL BLOCK and press or .
- 2. Scroll ♥ to BY NUMBER and press ok.
- 3. Scroll \P to **DELETE ALL**, press $\frac{\text{MENU}}{\text{OK}}$.
- 4. The display shows CONFIRM?.
- 5. Press ok to confirm or to cancel.

6. Caller ID and the Calls list

Important

To use Caller ID, you must first subscribe to the service from your network provider. A subscription fee may be payable.

To ensure that the caller's name is displayed, make sure you have stored the full telephone number, including the area code in the phonebook.

If the number is unavailable, UNAVAILABLE will be displayed.

If the call is from an international number, INTERN'L will be displayed.

If the call is from the operator, **OPERATOR** will be displayed. If the call is from a payphone, **PAYPHONE** will be displayed.

If the call is from a ringback request, RINGBACK will be displayed.

6.1 Caller ID

If subscribed to Caller ID, the caller's number will be displayed (provided it is not withheld) prior to answering the call. The display can show the last 12 digits or characters of the phone numbers and names.

If the caller's name and number are stored in the phonebook and a number match is found, the caller's name will be displayed instead.

6.2 Calls list

The Calls list stores details of the last 20 received calls, including the phone number and date and time of the call.

The caller's details are stored in the Calls list whether or not the call has been answered. When the list is full, and a new call is received, the oldest entry will be deleted automatically.

6.2.1 View the Calls list

- Press to open the Calls list. If there are no calls in the list, the display shows LIST EMPTY.
- 2. Press ▲ or 🗣 to scroll through the list.
 - If the call was answered, icon is displayed as you scroll to the entry. If the call was unanswered, icon is displayed as you scroll to the entry. When you reach the end of the list the display will show ------
 - If the caller's number exactly matches an entry stored in the phonebook, the display will show the name. Keep pressing or to see the date and time of the call and the caller's number.
 - If the telephone number is longer than 12 digits, ▶ icon is displayed. Press
 to see the remaining digits.

6.2.2 Dial a number in the Calls list

- 1. Press \P to open the Calls list.
- 2. Scroll \blacktriangle or \P to the entry you want.
- 3. Press 4 to dial the displayed entry.

6.2.3 Copy a Calls list number to the phonebook

- 1. Press v to open the Calls list.
